ENZIAN TO SHOWCASE SUMMER OPERA SERIES

Orlando, FL – (June 2, 2009) – Enzian has partnered with Emerging Pictures to bring the best in high definition opera from around the world to Central Florida through a summer series of digital projection presentations beginning June 13. Moviegoers will be able to enjoy productions of Verdi's DON CARLO, RIGOLETTO and OTELLO as well as Mozart's DON GIOVANNI, Tcherniakov's EUGENE ONEGIN, and Gounod's ROMEO ET JULIETTE with most performances playing twice. These productions were filmed at a selection of prestigious venues including La Scala, the Salzburg Festival, the Bolshoi at L'Opera de Paris, and the Teatro Regio (Parma).
