# ENZIAN PRESENTS THE 18th ANNUAL CENTRAL FLORIDA JEWISH FILM FESTIVAL

**Orlando, FL** – (October 19, 2016) – The 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Central Florida Jewish Film Festival, taking place November 12<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup>, is a cinematic celebration of Jewish life, culture, and history. Using the power of film to inform, educate, and most of all entertain, the festival challenges conventional perspectives on issues facing all of us. This program is part of Enzian's cultural festival circuit and is co-presented with The Roth Family Jewish Community Center of Greater Orlando and sponsored by Orlando Weekly.

A special menu will also be offered throughout the festival, including: Spinach & Cheese Knishes, Latkes, Holishkes, Hebrew National Hot Dogs, and Beef, Carrot, & Sweet Potato Tzimmes.

### WHAT: FANNY'S JOURNEY

# Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup> at 7:30PM at the Orlando Science Center *Southeast Premiere!*

Based on a true story, FANNY'S JOURNEY is an incredible tale of bravery, strength, daring, and survival. In 1943, 13-year-old Fanny and her younger sisters were sent from their home in France to an Italian foster home for Jewish children. When the Nazis arrive in Italy, their caretakers desperately organize the departure of the children to Switzerland. Suddenly left on their own, these 11 children will do the impossible to reach the Swiss border in order to survive.

The third feature of Lola Doillon, daughter of the great French director Jacques Doillon (*Ponette*), FANNY'S JOURNEY is adapted from the autobiographical novel by Fanny Ben Ami. It brings together a remarkable group of young actors to vividly depict this amazing, dangerous adventure and truly inspiring story.

for this compelling, informative, eye-opening, and highly entertaining film that won the Audience Award at the 2016 Palm Beach Jewish Film Festival.

With Sam back, Moos realizes her life has been on hold taking care of her widowed father and she needs to follow her own dreams. To everyone's surprise, she auditions for the academy of performing arts. Despite the encouragement from her handsome singing teacher, Moos quickly learns that not everybody is as receptive to her talents and she might need an option B. Meanwhile, Sam starts to realize his feelings for Moos may not have faded over the years. A movie about love, laughter, and friendship, MOOS is a charming and original Dutch romantic comedy with a kosher twist.

### **AIDA'S SECRETS**

Family secrets, lies, high drama and generations of contemporary history unspool in this spellbinding international story that begins with World War II and concludes with an emotional 21st-century family reunion. Izak was born inside the Bergen-Belsen displaced persons camp in 1945 and sent for adoption in Israel. Secret details of his birth mother, an unknown brother in Canada and his father's true identity slowly emerge in this extremely personal investigative film. Timely questions of identity, resilience, compassion and the plight of displaced persons are brought to life as Izak and Shep, the almost 70-year-old brothers, finally meet in Canada, then head to a nursing home in Quebec to introduce Shep to his elderly mother, Aida, for the first time. ### THE WOMEN'S BALCONY

When the women's balcony in an Orthodox Jerusalem synagogue collapses during a bar mitzvah celebration, the congregation goes into crisis. The young and charismatic Rabbi David appears to be a savior after the accident, but slowly starts pushing his fundamentalist ways and tries to take control. This severely tests the women's friendships and creates an almost Lysistrata-type rift between the community's women

and men. Featuring some of Israel's top women comics, this rousing, good-natured tale is a warm, humorous, and poignant portrait of a modern Orthodox community whose unity is imperiled by an arrogant interloper. Emil Ben Shimon's feature debut is a comical feminist narrative, at once rebellious and respectful in spirit, about finding the right path to happiness and the subjectivity of righteousness.
