ENZIAN PRESENTS THE 26th ANNUAL BROUHAHA FILM & VIDEO SHOWCASE

Orlando, FL – (November 8, 2017) – Brouhaha has quietly grown to become one of the premier outlets for locally produced films and videos, the best work from film schools statewide, and a fun-filled gathering for lovers of independent film. Audiences are made up of filmmakers, film educators, local production representatives, industry organization members, and the general public, all fascinated by the scope and creativity of films screened each year representing the entire spectrum of Florida's immense talent pool.

This year, Brouhaha will feature 56 films representing 12 different schools, along with 8 FilmSlam Audience Award winners and 2 Reel Short Teen Film Festival winners. A jury of industry professionals will choose their favorites and those films, along with an audience award winner, will move on to premiere at the 27th Annual Florida Film Festival (April 6-15, 2018).

The 26th Annual Brouhaha Film & Video Showcase will take place November 18th & 19th, 2017.
